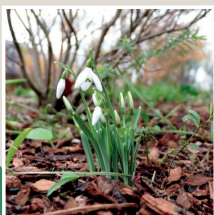

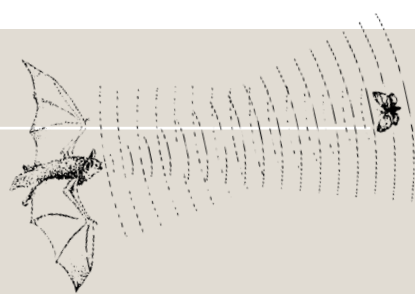

OUTDOOR LEARNING



As the leaves fall, Putney's commitment to environmental learning is as vigorous as ever.

The findings from our award-winning Biophilic Classroom study have been shared with other schools both at home and internationally, and the project continues to inform the sustainable development of both the Senior and Junior schools.

Thanks to your generosity, in the last year our Ecologist in Residence has worked with students to broaden their knowledge of diverse habitats and protected species, while embedding a greater understanding of ecology within the curriculum.

This autumn, we are studying bats roosting on the school's site and look forward to the installation of Putney's own weather station to support our meteorological data collection. Our Gardening Club and Eco-Committee have seen the fruits of their labours, as spectacular wildflower strips, herb and bog gardens around the grounds have matured and flourished. We now have four House gardens and QR codes are being installed on our trees, so we can learn more about the 'nature under our noses'.

Our Biophilic Classroom research has shown us the benefits of spending time 'in nature' and with these lessons in mind, this year's Putney Fund will be raising money to provide further opportunities for outdoor learning.

Putney High School is extremely lucky to have some wonderful outdoor spaces. We would like to fully utilise these parts of our Junior and Senior schools to show the beauty of nature and to cultivate students' growing interest. Already we are planning an outdoor classroom, a space for younger pupils to interact with the natural world through play-based and multi-sensory activities. We would also like to build a glass house and raised beds to grow vegetables, fruit and herbs; to extend our solar powered watering system, and to install 'swift boxes' to encourage nesting on our site.
